



Geese fly thousands of miles in formation between their summer and winter homes.



All Levels: Goose Collagraph Print Resources

Materials/Resources: Collagraph	Health & Safety Issues
 Design, printing paper Card for print-block Textured materials Glue: hot glue gun, PVA, epoxy resin Scissors/craft knife, cutting board Ink roller, block printing ink & palette Press, baren, roller, spoon for burnishing 	 Safe cutting techniques and tools Safe use of hot glue-gun Good ventilation for epoxy resins

All Levels: Goose Collagraph Print Learning Activities







- 1. Draw design on card and prepare: collagraph materials, glue, scissors.
- 2. Glue textured materials to card to create a collagraph design.

(All Levels can use PVA glue. Level 3 can use hot glue guns).

3. Cut around goose shape.

Antelope Migration





All Levels: Antelope Stencil Print Resources


All Levels: Materials/Resources Stencil

- Stencil design for paper, fabric, wall.
- Stencil material: paper, card, acetate.
- To waterproof paper stencil coat in PVA glue solution.
- Scissors/craft knife, cutting board.
- Paint: acrylic, spray-paint, ink, powder- Use a breathing mask paint.
- Sponge, stipple-brush, rag

Health & Safety Issues

- Torn paper stencils can be used with Level 1.
- Safe knife technique: use cutting board with hand away from blade.
- with spray-paint.

All Levels: Antelope Stencil Print Learning Activities







- 1. Draw design on paper or acetate stencil material.
- 2. Level 1 can tear paper stencil.
 Levels 2 & 3 can use scissors/knife to cut stencil.
- 3. Stencil is ready.
- 4. Use stippling brush, sponge or spray to paint.
- 5. Repeat stencil to create pattern.

Butterfly Migration







All Levels: Butterfly Poly-print Resources

Level 1 & 2: Materials/Resources Poly-print	Health & Safety Issues
 Level 1 Poly-print block; printing paper 	• Supervise safe cutting.
 Biro or sharp pencil Roller, water-based ink, palette/board Press, baren, roller or spoon for rubbing down print 	 Safe use of pen/pencil
Level 2As above with addition of:Scalpel or craft knife	 Safe cutting: cut on a cutting board with hand away from the blade.

Level 1: Monochrome Poly-print Learning Activities









- 1. Draw design on poly-print block using biro or sharp pencil press hard to make an indent.
- 2. Use scissors or knife to cut away stencil design. Safe cutting with hand away from blade.
- 3. Ink block with a roller then burnish with baren or roller.
- 4. Finished monochrome print.

Level 2: Polychrome Poly-print Learning Activities









- 5.Use scissors or knife to cut away stencil design. Safe cutting with hand away from blade.
- 6.Ink block with a roller then burnish with baren or roller.
- 7.2nd colour added, continue process.
- 8. Finished 3 colour polychrome print.





- 1. Draw design on lino. Prepare: bench-hook clamped to table, lino-cutting tools, printing materials.
- 2. Safely cut away design keeping fingers behind lino-cutting blade.
- 3. Cut around boat shape.


