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Theme 2C Focus: Performing Our Stories

Theme 2C explores and represents global stories using puppetry skills and Forum Theatre through its focus on:

- Creation
- Performance
- Evaluation

Learning Resources & Materials

Materials:

- Paper and pens. sticks, spoons, fabric, paper, tape, string, cardboard, old socks and gloves, magazines and newspaper, scissors, box of props, thin plastic sheets (polythene), coloured paper/foil. Tables and chairs
- ▶ Build a props and costume box: fabric, costume, random objects such as envelope, piece of jewellery, watch, photo, items of clothing such as a scarf or a hat, a small box, old glasses, a key etc.

All Levels: Performing with Puppets

Some simple rules of puppetry which will help:

Focus your eyes on the puppet, not the audience

Find the movement that reflects the energy and personality of puppet

Make sure any words spoken match the action of the puppet.

Use props to help tell the story
Use a table as a stage for the puppets
Black gloves and black clothes can help keep the puppet to the fore



Level 1 Learning Activities: Make a puppet out of things you can find:

- Old socks and gloves
- Cuttings from magazines
- Draw around your hand and cut it out
- Join paper body parts together with string.
- Cardboard
- Spoons draw a face on a spoon
- ▶ Try mixing them up! Add extra detail.

Level 1 Learning Activities The Three Little Pigs and the Big Bad Wolf Story

- ► The first pig built a house of straw. The second pig built a house of wood. The third pig built a house of bricks.
- ▶ One day the Big Bad Wolf was hungry. He blew down the first pig's house. The little pig ran to his brother's house.
- ► The wolf was still hungry. He blew down the second pig's house. The two pigs ran to their brother's house.
- ▶ The wolf was still hungry. He went to the third pig's house. He blew and blew, but the house didn't fall down.
- He climbed on to the roof and jumped down the chimney. He fell into the fire! Ooowwww! He climbed up the chimney very fast and ran away. The three little pigs lived happily ever after.

Pig cartoon (CC PD)

Design and make puppets to tell the story.

- Use ideas from Theme 2B Finger or Rod puppets
- > Add music, words and props.

Try considering some different outcomes:

- > What would happen if the wolf had blown the third little pig's house down?
- Or had not been able to blow down the first little pig's house?

Level 1 & 2: Create a Newspaper Puppet





- 1. Get some newspaper and roll into columns
- 2. Assemble two of the columns to make a body and the arms
- 3. Add the legs
- 4. Add a head.
- 5. Then tape up or fix with string a lot of tape and string -to make very strong and secure

- This kind of a simple puppet is best animated on a table by 3 people. One person operates the head and one arm, the second takes care of another arm and holds the body and the third is responsible for moving feet.
- ▶ A simplified animation with 2 people is also possible.
- Experiment make animals, people, fantasy creatures. Perform with them!

Level 2 continued:

- ▶ Tell the story to the group. In groups of 4/6, chose one story and act it out without words. Then add words and music.
- Design and make puppets for the story
- ▶ Create set, find props and rehearse.
- ▶ Chose two different places where you want to change the story.
- Perform both versions and discuss the difference




Level 2 Learning Activities: Ali Baba and the 40 Thieves

- ➤ Design and make the story's puppet characters.
- > Add music, words and props.
- Try using some different outcomes what would happen if:
- ➤ Ali Baba forgot the magic words?
- ➤ Or if Morgiana did not recognize the oil seller?

Level 2 continued:

In groups of 4/6, make up a story or chose one from your own culture which involves overcoming an obstacle.

Design and make puppets for the story

Have one person sit in front of the group facing away from them. The rest of the group stand behind with their puppets. The sitting person cannot see the people behind him/her. Tell the story in their own words. The actors then have to act out what the narrator is saying.

Create a set, find props, add music and rehearse.

Chose two different places where you want to change the story. Perform both versions and discuss the difference

Level 3 Learning Activities: Forum Theatre

- Create a puppet of yourself use any method.
- > Introduce the group to your story using your puppet.
- > The audience members ask the puppets questions.
- > Think of a problem you have had in the past.
- > Tell it to the audience: who-where-when-why-what (no names).

Discuss. What is the problem and how has it happened? What can be done? What are the options?

- > Choose a few stories and act them out:
- > The person whose story is being acted out is the director.
- The director tells the cast how to animate the story using puppets, music and props.

Level 3 Learning Activities: Forum Theatre

- 2 puppets start a scene: a family meal, school-day, journey, conflict, celebration.
- ▶ An audience member shouts 'Freeze' & the puppets must freeze.
- ▶ The audience member replaces one of the acting puppets.
- ▶ Their puppet speaks/acts to start a completely new scenario.
- ▶ Repeat & continue.....

Level 3 Learning Activities: Forum Theatre

WHAT IF?

3 or 4 participants stand at the front of the group with their puppets.

The audience suggests a "what if?'" question. Eg:

- What if you missed the bus/train?
- What if someone stole your money?
- ▶ What if someone insulted a family member?
- Write down a list of possible 'what if' scenarios.

The puppets act out the scenario - what are their solutions?

Other volunteers act out alternate endings.
