What's new in ArtsTogether?

During the past months, the **ArtsTogether** team has worked towards reaching the target group of the Project and disseminating the quality results produced throughout the past two years.

Grassroots Events

Two grassroots events were held during October 2019: one in Palermo, Italy, organized by Centro per lo Sviluppo Danilo Dolce, and one in Thessaloniki, Greece, organized by ARSIS.

These events were a great opportunity for interaction and enjoyment between migrant communities and local populations, through various intercultural activities where both children and parents were invited to participate.

In total, more than 110 people were involved in the grassroots events.



Public Roundtables

On the 7th and 18th of October 2019, public roundtables were organized in Bologna, by the University of Bologna, and in Athens, by HIGGS and the University of the Peloponnese, respectively.

The main objective of these roundtables was to bring together, engage and create a space for interaction between educational organizations, public authorities, social stakeholders, migrants' communities, universities, and experts of the field.

During the Conference, the consortium presented the final results of the Project to representatives of EU institutions, NGOs, and other key stakeholders

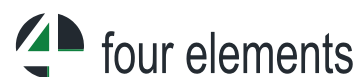
